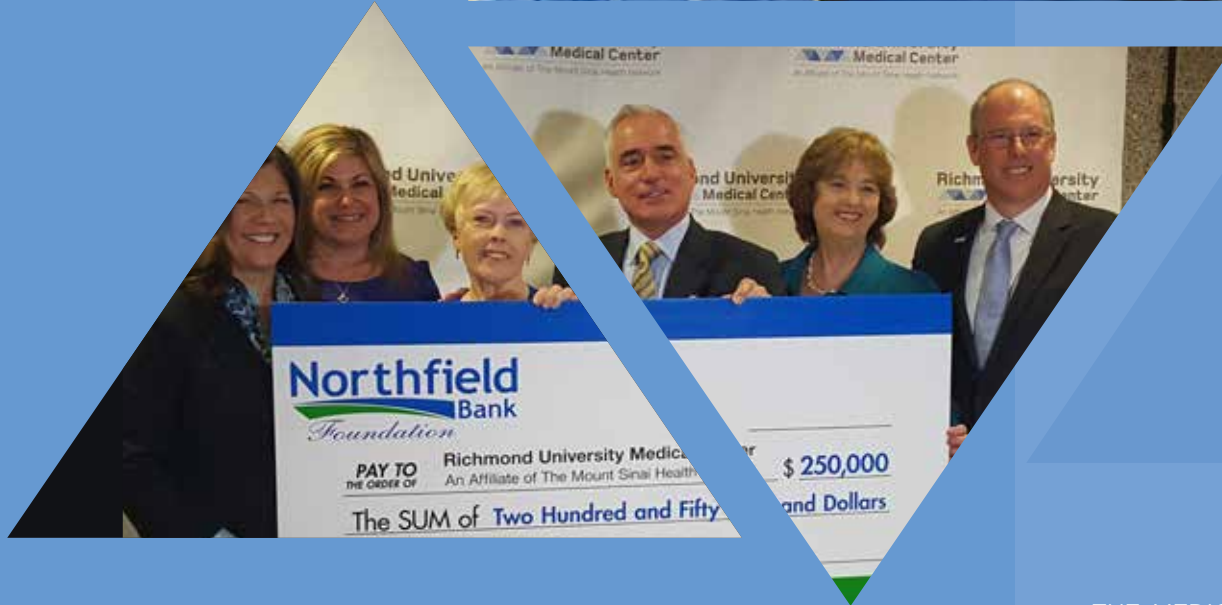

With your support and dedication, Richmond University Medical Center was able to take substantial steps forward in 2016.

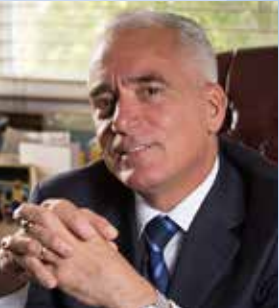

With every initiative it undertakes, Richmond University Medical Center looks toward improving the health of our community. The year 2016 brought us new milestones in our endeavor to bring patient-focused care to the people of Staten Island.

To the public, our most visible commitment shows in our breaking ground for the new James P. Molinaro Emergency Department, which will be the metropolitan area’s most

advanced and modern facility.

We have also expanded our reach by opening comprehensive primary care facilities, which is integral to our community based strategy. Open six days a week, these centers see over a thousand patients a month, a significant number of whom are walk-ins. By improving access, we improve care, and we strengthen our bonds with our patients.

Just as valuable are the strides that we have taken in our state- and federally-funded initiatives around Medicare and Medicaid programs. Our Accountable Care Organization, one of the most successful in the tri-state area, has been effective in both reducing costs and achieving patient satisfaction from our Medicare patients. Our Medicaid efforts earned high acclaim from Jason Helgeson, the New York State Medicaid Director, who states that we are “leading the way for healthcare system transformation in New York.”

Our departments continue to shine. Our trauma center received verification from the American College of Surgeons as the only dually-accredited Level I Adult Trauma Center and Level II Pediatric Center in the City of New York. The cardiology department, with its fully PCI-capable cardiac catheterization lab, administers life-saving treatment every day. Our radiation oncologists develop custom treatment plans for each patient they see. Our research department published its first volume of abstracts. There is no denying we are on the move!

Our staff hosted parties for cancer survivors, taught summer youth programs, participated in health awareness fairs, and held cancer screenings — just a few of the ways we let our community residents know how much we care about their health and wellness.

I am proud of the hard work and dedication of the Board, the medical staff, and all the employees of this hospital. We are resolved in our commitment to work for, and with, our community.

PATIENT SUCCESS STORY
FROM THE PATIENT’S PERSPECTIVE

The radiation oncology department at Richmond University Medical Center has two ardent supporters in Barbara Kelly, 58, and John Kelly, 61. Each was diagnosed with cancer and needed radiation treatment, and both received that treatment here.

“I had needed radiation treatment in 1999 for my right breast, and ended up being over-radiated. It was hard to find a doctor who would treat me after that, but Dr. Adams stepped up,” says Barbara. “He really kept an eye on me — there were lots of visits, and lots of tracking. Any time I needed to see him, there was never any problem to call up and see him that day or very soon thereafter. He had to give me a very specialized plan because of my situation, and he watched me for everything.

“In 2013, cancer was found in my left breast. It was removed, and this time I went straight to Richmond University Medical Center. I had 28 radiation treatments — and it was such a different experience than with my first doctor. I was able to keep working. The doctor and staff waited for me — every time — so that I could get to my treatment after work. I can’t say enough about the staff, even the people at the front desk,” she continues. “It’s not so scary when you’re dealing with people like that. Every doctor I go to, I compare to Dr. Adams.”

Her husband agrees. When he was diagnosed with prostate cancer by Jay B. Basillote, MD, a Richmond University Medical Center specialist, after a routine test in 2008, Dr. Basillote and Dr. Adams performed the necessary surgery together. Ninety radiation seeds were implanted, all activated at different times. “I had follow-up visits for several months to make sure they were in correctly and that there were no problems. After six months, I was cancer free. I’m still going for follow-ups, to this day,” says John. “There are never any problems making appointments — they could always see me within a day or two. And when I had to miss work, the staff took care of all the paperwork for me. Everything was easy.”

The two are unanimous in their praise of the team. “They take time to treat you like family — you don’t feel as if you’re there for cancer.”

PROGRESS ON HEALTH CARE INITIATIVES

RICHMOND UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER CONTINUES ITS INVOLVEMENT IN A STATEWIDE PROGRAM THAT FOCUSES ON IMPROVING MEDICAID CARE.

The Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) project continues, in its second year, to focus on improving the care of the Medicaid patients located on Staten Island. Richmond University has been actively involved because of the number of patients in the area who meet the criteria, including those who are Medicaid recipients; high utilizers of services; high non-compliant patients; and frequent visitors to the emergency department.

The Staten Island Performing Provider System (PPS) has been the leader for the borough in bringing together 33 community providers to implement strategies and programs to meet the objectives set out by New York State.

Dan Messina, PhD, FACHE, President & CEO, says, referring to the successful achievements in 2016, “Our local PPS has been the trailblazer for the DSRIP work being implemented in New York State.” He adds, “Crain’s Pulse listed the Staten Island PPS as the top performing DSRIP organization in New York State.”

A large part of that success is the result of the hard work and persistence of the team at Richmond University Medical Center. The ambulatory center, working with all providers, has made its mark on the necessary programs to extend the care provided for the Medicaid population. “Our hospital has embraced the concept of population health, which is the foundation of the DSRIP program. We have identified gaps of care in the community and implemented programs to address these,” reports Richard Salhany, MBA, FACHE,



Senior Vice President. “The work we have implemented in 2016 is transformational and will impact local health care for the better far beyond the life of the DSRIP project.”

SOME OF THE PROJECTS INCLUDE:

▲ IMPLEMENTATION OF PATIENT ACTIVATION ACTIVITIES

Project Goal: Address Patient Activation Measures (PAM) so that uninsured, non-utilizing, or low utilizing populations are impacted by DSRIP projects. This project is centered on patient activation and engagement, health literacy, and practices to reduce health care disparities.

This program has Community Health Workers meet with each patient annually and give them a PAM survey. This survey documents the chief complaint of the patient, identifies the barriers to care, and identifies the primary decision maker in the family for health related issues. Patients are then linked to the appropriate programs for treatment.

▲ INTEGRATION OF PRIMARY CARE & BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

Project Goal: Integrate mental health and substance abuse with primary care services to ensure coordination of care for both services.

The implementation of co-located services in both the Behavioral Health Outpatient setting and primary care setting focuses on one-stop shopping for patients who may not take the extra step to reach out to another provider. According to Paula Caputo, MPA, Assistant Vice President of Ambulatory Care, “We had the opportunity to create the co-location services just by adding a nurse practitioner who can address both the medical and psychiatric issues discovered during the visit.”

▲ INCREASE ACCESS TO HIGH QUALITY CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTATIVE CARE & MANAGEMENT

Project Goal: Help increase access to high quality chronic disease preventative care and management in both clinical and community settings for chronic diseases.

Richmond University Medical Center has a comprehensive diabetic program that includes endocrinology, nutritionist, ophthalmology, and podiatry services.

GROWING OUR SERVICE LINES: RADIATION ONCOLOGY

A RADIATION ONCOLOGY PRACTICE THAT TAKES A TEAM APPROACH TO HEALING

The radiation oncology practice at Richmond University Medical Center has the longest continuous physician presence of any practice on Staten Island; Marc Adams, MD, a radiation oncologist, has been its director for over 25 years. This continuity of care speaks to the value the department brings to the community. Together, Dr. Adams and Hoon Lee, MD, radiation oncologist at Richmond University Medical Center, have a combined forty years of experience in the field — they have been practicing on Staten Island for longer than any other radiation oncologists.

The doctors take a team approach to healing, and work closely with subspecialty doctors and surgeons on Staten Island and Manhattan.

“Even if one patient’s cancer is the same as another’s, that doesn’t mean they get the same treatment. The diagnosis, the plan, the patient’s general health, the specifics of the disease and its progression — each patient we treat has a custom treatment plan,” says Dr. Adams, who attended medical school at the University of Alabama at Birmingham and performed his radiation oncology residency at St. Barnabas Medical Center. Dr. Lee attended medical school at George Washington University School of Medical and Health Sciences and completed his radiation oncology residency at University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Drs. Adams and Lee are also known in their field for their expertise in treatment of prostate cancer, a subject on which they have multiple publications.

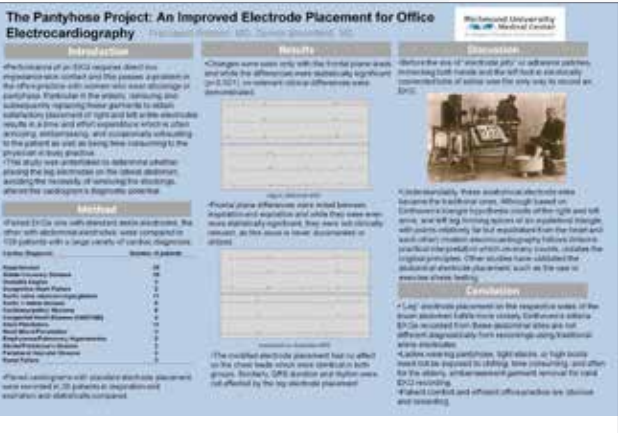
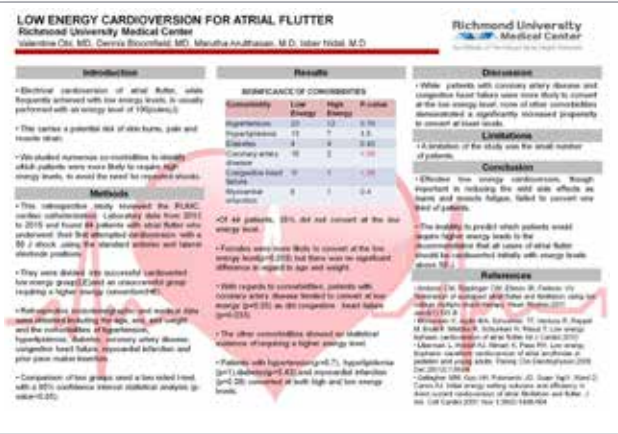
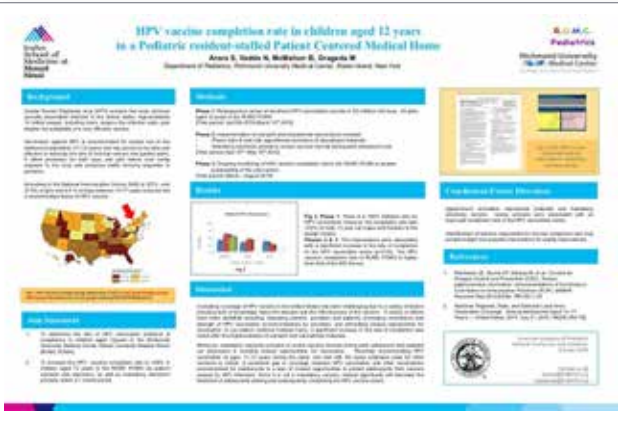
RESEARCH DEPARTMENT PUBLISHES FIRST JOURNAL

FILLING AN ESSENTIAL NEED IN THE COMMUNITY

Several years ago, the Medical Center identified many trends in the community, including the shortage of primary care physicians (PCP) and limited access to care on Staten Island. The Medical Center has been successful in establishing practices and placing the primary care physicians in strategic locations within the community to fill this service void. The sites have become connected through electronic medical records (E-Clinical Work or ECW). Most recently, the large centers have been providing not only primary care, but immediate and walk-in care.

The site at 1058 Forest Avenue was purchased and the Medical Center made a significant investment to renovate the building down to the core. As a result, this 4,000 square foot center is now a state-of-the-art medical facility. This site has combined the practices of local primary care physicians and

nurse practitioners including:

The site provides care six days a week, accepting both patients who have appointments and those who are walk-in. “The ability to have the Center accept patients for walk-in and immediate care provides a large benefit for the community,” reported Daniel J. Messina, PhD, FACHE, President and Chief Executive Officer. “We provide an alternative to visiting an Emergency Department for the lower acuity ailments.”

The site also offers radiology services, EKG, and rapid laboratory testing. “Patients can also come to the site for pre-operative clearance, annual wellness visits, diagnostic testing and immunizations,” stated Dr. Pietro Carpenito, Executive Vice

President. “It is one-stop comprehensive medical care.”

The Center sees almost 1,000 patients each month with a significant number of walk-in clients. “This has had a positive impact on improving access to primary care services in the area. In addition, once they come into the site, they are pleased with the stellar appearance. If they don’t

have an existing physician, they can choose from one of the physicians on the panel as their permanent physician.”

The site has received accolades from the community. In 2016, it received the prestigious Chamber of Commerce Building Award for Excellence in Exterior and Interior Design, Decorating and Outdoor Space.

Richard Salhany, MBA, FACHE, Senior Vice President reported, “The Center is open before, during, and after regular working hours, for the convenience of the community.”

For additional convenience, bus service is right on the corner; there are also 30 parking spaces available.

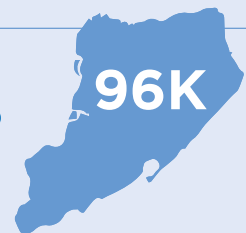
NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES



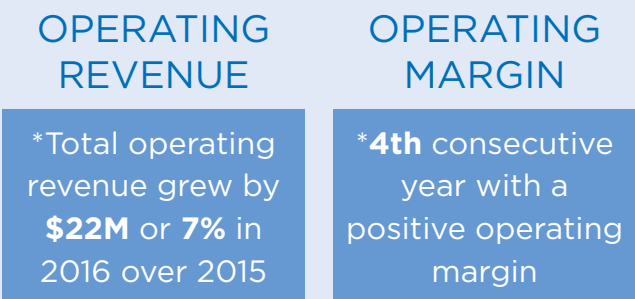
EXTENT OF OUR COMMUNITY SERVICE CONTRIBUTION
