Outpatient Mental Health Services

Committed to providing comprehensive evaluation and treatment for the children, adolescents, and families in our community. Services are provided by board certified psychiatrists and licensed clinical professionals. Services are able to assist with life challenges, relationship issues, behavioral issues, depression, anxiety, trauma, and persistent mental illness. Treatment is delivered using a multidisciplinary, team-based approach with clinicians who emphasize family involvement for both diagnostic and therapeutic services. Treatment options include:

- ▶ Individual therapy
- ▶ Parental support
- ▶ Child skills training
- ▶ Family therapy
- ▶ Trauma treatment
- ▶ Psychiatric evaluation
- ▶ Medication management

Fees are determined on a sliding scale. Medicaid and third-party insurance is accepted. Evening and Saturday hours available.

Children's Day Treatment

Children's Day Treatment, is a site-based, structured mental health program. It consists of psychotherapy and skills training services in a therapeutic educational setting for children and adolescents in grades K-12 with severe emotional or behavioral challenges. Individual, group, and family therapies are combined with small classes for a comprehensive treatment process. The high school division offers linkage to college and vocational skills training opportunities for summer youth employment. Services are available throughout the year and are provided using a multidisciplinary team approach under the clinical supervision of a mental health professional. Services are not part of inpatient or residential treatment services. The goals of Day Treatment include:

- ▶ Stabilizing the child's mental health status.
- ▶ Developing and improving the child's independent living and socialization skills.
- ▶ Providing training to enable the child to live in the community.

ASAP: Adolescent & Adult Substance Abuse Program

ASAP provides treatment and support for adolescents, teenagers, adults, and their families struggling with substance abuse and dependency. Children and significant others who have been affected by another family member's substance use may receive services as well. ASAP is licensed through NYS Office of Addiction and Support Services (OASAS). ASAP is directed by and has services provided by master's level therapists and certified addiction counselors.

Head Start

The First Head Start Program on Staten Island

Staten Island's first Head Start program is also the first Head Start program in the country provided through the support and administration of a full service hospital. Head Start promotes school readiness for children ages birth to five from low-income families.

About the Curriculum

Head Start begins preparing children for kindergarten from the time they enter the program until graduation day. Head Start uses a research-based curriculum called High Scope. High Scope's active learning model provides inclusive experiences for children with and without disabilities, allowing children at all levels to succeed.

Along with the High Scope curriculum, Head Start utilizes an ongoing assessment tool called the Child Observation Record or COR. This COR data is analyzed three times per year by our School Readiness Team to assess the trends in our schools. This approach allows the team to review the data to ensure the Common Core standards and key developmental indicators, along with the Head Start framework, are met in the classrooms.

Family Engagement

Our program takes great pride in its ability to connect with parents by engaging them with their child's education as well as empowering them to be the best advocates possible for themselves and their children. It is done through the unique way of forming a partnership with the entire family, including:

- ▶ Group work with a focus on parenting skills, stress management and crisis intervention.
- ▶ A dedicated women's empowerment group, and a men's group.
- ▶ Workshops with speakers on mental health, special educational needs, nutrition, housing, immigration, legal issues, and child abuse prevention.
- ▶ The opportunity to enroll in ESL and/or GED classes.

We know that parents are a child's first and most important teachers. School Readiness Teams are also formed comprising parents and program staff who review educational outcomes and implement strategies to assure that the highest quality of services are provided.

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Health Homes Serving Children

Long-term care coordination program for children with active Medicaid, two or more chronic health conditions OR one qualifying Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) diagnosis. Care managers oversee and provide access to all services an individual needs promote health and prevent use of emergency services. Services are provided in community settings and in our facility.

Project LAUNCH

A federal initiative created by the National Center for Healthy Safe Children and funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Project LAUNCH specifically aims to:

- Ensure children are ready to learn when entering school
- Improve coordination and collaboration amongst systems serving children
- Build infrastructure by increasing the availability of quality, evidence-based programming
- Increase children’s and their families’ access to top-notch prevention, wellness, and physical and behavioral health services

Richmond University Medical Center is amongst a handful of grant recipients for Project LAUNCH, a highly competitive program with only 12 other grantees at any given time. What we learn throughout the five-year term of the grant will help communities influence state-, territorial-, and tribal-level systems changes and policy improvements.

Project LAUNCH’s services are open to children ages eight and younger, their caregivers, and expecting caregivers living in the North Shore area of Staten Island, including the following zip codes:

Clinical Services

Diagnostic evaluation is an important first step to connecting you with the right resources and support. These assessments provide information about a person's level of cognitive, academic, social-adaptive, and emotional functioning. We work holistically with people of all ages. Our assessments are multi-disciplinary, capturing multiple areas of functioning, strengths and disability.

Evaluation and clinical services are provided to individuals with developmental disabilities and to caregivers and supporters deemed necessary to maintain the effectiveness of the treatment, enable the individual to remain in his or her current residential setting, and who enhance the individual's quality of life. We collaborate with schools, other agencies, and clinicians to make recommendations for treatment. Services provided at the main clinic or a satellite site by appropriately licensed/certified practitioners may include:

- ▶ Physical therapy
- ▶ Occupational therapy
- ▶ Psychology
- ▶ Speech and language pathology
- ▶ Social work

A full complement of services, including comprehensive diagnosis, treatment, counseling, speech/language/occupational therapies, supportive services, preschool inclusion classes at Head Start, programs for children with autism spectrum disorders, specialized services for adults and parents.

Multi-disciplinary services are available for persons of all ages challenged with developmental, intellectual, autism, or neurological disabilities. Follow-up and advocacy services are provided and Medicaid, Medicare, and some third-party insurance accepted.

Early Childhood Mental Health Services and Programs

Significant mental health problems can occur in young children from birth to 5 years of age. In some cases, these problems can have serious consequences for early learning, social competence, and lifelong physical health. Children can show clear characteristics of anxiety disorders, attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, conduct disorder, depression, posttraumatic stress disorder, and neurodevelopmental disabilities, such as autism, at a very early age. Young children respond to and process emotional experiences and traumatic events in ways that are very different from older children and adults. Consequently, diagnosis in early childhood can be even more difficult than it is in adults.

The Early Childhood Mental Health Program provides treatment for infants to children 5 years of age and their families. Our expert clinical staff uses evidence-based and trauma-focused therapies to develop personalized treatments to optimize positive outcomes.

Services include:

- ▶ Comprehensive preschool evaluations and related services
- ▶ Early childhood mental health services
- ▶ Parent-infant dyadic therapy
- ▶ Full-day integrated preschool classrooms in a head start setting for children 3 to 4 years old

Adult Outpatient Mental Health Services

Where to Begin: Evaluation and Referral

Individuals 18 years of age or older seeking treatment are first seen in our Evaluation and Referral Unit, located at the Center for Integrated Behavioral Medicine. Clinicians at this division perform comprehensive assessments for all patients who are seeking outpatient treatment, including those with behavioral health or substance use disorders.

After the initial assessment is completed, patients are referred to the most appropriate behavioral health or substance use disorder program that best meets their needs:

Partial Hospitalization Program – Bridges to Wellness

A Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP) is a short-term, intensive, highly-structured outpatient behavioral health treatment approach aimed at stabilizing patients experiencing acute mental health symptoms. PHP is often a step-down from inpatient psychiatry, a step-up from an intensive outpatient program and can be used as an alternative to psychiatric hospitalization or to shorten an inpatient hospitalization. As an outpatient treatment, it is less restrictive than an inpatient setting and facilitates recovery in the community. Patients age 18 and older receive intensive group and individual therapy, medication evaluation and management, and family support and education within a supportive therapeutic environment.

St. George Outpatient Programs

Provides comprehensive psychiatric and substance use disorder services and integrated medical services including individual and group therapy, marital and couples therapy, diagnostic services and medication management (including injectable medication), and crisis intervention. Individuals are assigned to one of three specialized tracks provided by licensed social workers, mental health counselors, and psychiatrists. All tracks have access to primary care to assess individual medical needs:

- ▶ **MICA track:** Recovery-oriented services provided to assist individuals who are interested in addressing both their mental health and substance use. Services may include individual therapy, groups, medication assisted treatment, and urine drug testing. Services are tailored to an individual's plan in improving their overall well-being.
- ▶ **St. George track:** Assists individuals in addressing their mental health concerns, symptoms, and stressors via therapy and/or medication management.
- ▶ **Community Treatment Clinic:** Works with individuals who are diagnosed with a developmental disability and also carry a psychiatric diagnosis. Treatment plans and frequency of treatment are developed based on clinical needs at the time of intake.

Lab work, nutritional and health counseling, referrals, and additional services are available on site.

West Brighton Clinic

West Brighton Clinic provides comprehensive psychiatric services including individual and group therapy, psychiatric evaluations, medication management and administrations of long-term injectable medication, and medical coordination of care. Our staff includes licensed social workers, licensed mental health counselors, psychiatrists and a nurse practitioner. West Brighton Clinic is an Opioid Overdose Prevention Program (OOPP) which dispenses Narcan to the West Brighton Community.

Harbor Terrace Clinic

Harbor Terrace provides on-site comprehensive mental health services to residents of the Harbor Terrace Adult Home with recovery-oriented and client-centered treatment. The Clinic provides individual therapy, group therapy, psychiatric evaluations, medication management, crisis management/intervention, case management, and preparation for independent living back in the community and/or optimal functioning in the adult home community.

Neuromodulation Treatment

What is Neuromodulation Treatment?

Neuromodulation treatment utilizes advanced medical technologies to enhance or suppress the nervous system. These treatments deliver painless, direct, and effective stimulation to sections of the brain.

Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT)

ECT is a proven, effective treatment for patients diagnosed with severe mental illnesses such as depression and bipolar disorder who are suicidal, have not responded well to medications, or cannot tolerate side effects of medications. Our ECT program includes an initial evaluation by board certified psychiatrists with specialized training in ECT. We take a multidisciplinary approach and have an anesthesiologist evaluating all patients and monitoring all treatments and interventions, as well as nursing assessments and interventions. ECT treatments are provided in a safe, secured, and monitored environment. All patients are monitored in a post-procedure recovery room.

There are both inpatient and outpatient treatment options. The frequency and duration of treatment is determined collaboratively between the ECT team and treating psychiatrists based on the patient's symptoms and input.

Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS)

Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation is a proven effective, non-invasive treatment for patients with major depressive disorder (MDD) and obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) who have not responded to one or more medications using the BrainsWay D system. Initial evaluation is conducted by attending psychiatrists with specialized training in TMS. The treatment is provided on an outpatient basis in a safe, secured, monitored, and comfortable environment. The initial evaluation is approximately 60 minutes. Treatment sessions are approximately 20 to 30 minutes.

Addiction Treatment Programs

Treating Addiction

Addiction affects not just the addict, but the family as well. We provide a variety of comprehensive addiction treatment programs and services administered by a highly trained, caring, and compassionate team of medical professionals.

Silberstein Clinic

The Silberstein Clinic serves individuals 18 and older who are seeking treatment for substance use and mental health concerns. It is a New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) licensed outpatient clinic and is fully staffed with licensed clinicians, medical and psychiatric personnel.

Therapeutic services include drug, alcohol, and mental health screening and assessment, individual and group psychotherapy/counseling, family therapy, treatment for significant others (i.e. spouse or parent of a client), and referral for additional community supports. Clients will work in collaboration with their treatment provider to develop a person-centered plan for substance use, care, and treatment. The plan of care may progress along the abstinence of harm reduction continuum, as determined by the client's goals. Psychiatric and medical services include psychiatric medication management, comprehensive medical care, and medication assisted treatment, including Suboxone, Sublocade, and Vivitrol.

In addition, specialized services are provided to mandated populations. This includes individuals on parole, probation, treatment court, ACS, or those needing to complete a DUI screening or assessment following a DUI incident.

The clinic aims to meet clients' wellness goals and establish a structured path toward recovery through an array of therapeutic modalities. Therapeutic services are tailored according to each individual's needs.

Center for Young Adults

The Center for Young Adults is an OASAS-licensed addiction program exclusively focusing on the treatment of adolescents and young adults ages 16 to 24. Therapeutic services include drug, alcohol, and mental health screening and assessment, individual and group psychotherapy/counseling, family therapy/counseling, and referral for additional community supports. Therapeutic services are tailored according to the needs and wishes of each individual.

Psychiatric and medical services include psychiatric medication management, comprehensive medical care, and medication-assisted treatment (Suboxone, Vivitrol). Treatment plans are patient-centered incorporating a whole-person approach, maximizing the strengths of each individual through an array of therapeutic modalities.

The combination of small program size, calming environment, and extensive therapeutic, psychiatric, and medical resources gives individuals the tools to develop optimally according to choice and potential. The Center for Young Adults is equipped to manage mandated treatment cases (probation, parole, school, employment, etc.).

Gamblers Treatment Program

The Gamblers Treatment Program is an outpatient clinic providing treatment and educational services to pathological gamblers 16 years of age and older, their families, and significant others. The program offers clients a comprehensive evaluation including psychiatric assessment, individual, marital, family and group therapy, medication management, and crisis intervention.

Emergency Services

In the event of a psychiatric emergency, we provide immediate, professionally trained care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Comprehensive Psychiatric Emergency Program (CPEP)

The only program of its kind on Staten Island, the Comprehensive Psychiatric Emergency Program (CPEP) is a multifaceted treatment program offering a full range of psychiatric emergency services including:

- ▶ Crisis intervention in an emergency room setting
- ▶ Comprehensive evaluation by a psychiatrist, nurse and social worker
- ▶ Referral and linkage to the appropriate community clinics within 5 days after the CPEP visit
- ▶ An extended observation unit (up to 72 hours), if needed
- ▶ Alcohol and substance use counseling
- ▶ Mobile outreach team
- ▶ 24 hour crisis hotline

Mobile Crisis Outreach Service

Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, the Mobile Crisis team is a component of the Comprehensive Psychiatric Emergency Program (CPEP) that responds to non-emergent crisis in the community. The mobile team is a multidisciplinary team that can also offer interim counseling to patients recently discharged from CPEP or the inpatient unit, or any time an individual in the community believes crisis outreach is necessary. Referrals will be seen within 24 to 48 hours. Family members, as well as professionals, may call the mobile crisis outreach service to make a referral.

Inpatient Psychiatric Programs

Our inpatient psychiatric services include 30 adult beds and a separate 10 bed unit for children and adolescents. Services include:

- ▶ Individual and group therapy
- ▶ Medication management
- ▶ Patient and family education
- ▶ Rehabilitative activities
- ▶ Electroconvulsive Treatment Program (ECT), which provides state-of-the-art evaluation and treatment for individuals with severe or treatment-resistant psychiatric conditions in a safe and secure environment.

Children and Adolescents

The child and adolescent program offers comprehensive assessment and treatment for those ages 3 to 18. Disorders such as behavioral disturbances, psychosis, and depression are treated in a structured environment with an emphasis on family participation. A school program is also provided, staffed by state certified teachers working closely with the patient's home school district.

Adults

In our adult inpatient unit, we treat patients 18 and older. The adult inpatient programs are designed to evaluate and stabilize adult patients in the acute phase of psychiatric illness through intensive short-term inpatient treatment. This treatment includes individual therapy, group therapy, crisis-oriented family therapy, medication management, and patient and family education.
