As we usher in 2019, I want to wish everyone a happy and safe holiday to you and your families. May the coming year be full of promise and achievement.

For our medical center, 2019 promises to be one of exciting growth. Behind the hospital we have started construction of a new parking lot that will provide over 220 new spaces for employees. Estimated to be completed by the

end of January, the new lot will be accessible only by hospital ID. In addition to the improved convenience and safety for our staff, this new parking lot will take cars off streets as we continue to be good neighbors with our surrounding community.

The parking lot in many ways is the kick off of major construction and campus wide development. We will also begin construction of our new 30,000 square foot emergency department in 2019. Private treatment rooms, expanded trauma bays, a larger waiting area, new sections for pediatrics and intensive care will all be part of the future of emergency care at RUMC. Also exciting is the construction and development of new surgical suites and perioperative support space. We estimate construction will take 24 months to complete.

We will also begin construction of a new co-generation plant. Our new plant will provide the hospital with it's own electricity, making us self-sustaining and more environmentally friendly.

Lastly, our medical center is the only hospital on Staten Island located outside of a flood zone. We need to be at full operating capacity even in the most dire of situations. Thanks to support from FEMA, over the next year or so we will be replacing the windows campus wide to make them resistant to hurricane strength winds while also modernizing our parking lots with a new drainage system to prevent flooding.

It's a great time to be part of the RUMC family. Remember the Power of One-you make a difference!

Lunch and Learn with Nancy Sayegh-Rooney, RN, CTTS




Movember Raises Awareness
